

## What is a Virtual Learning Environment (VLE)?

Our VLE is a personalised area on the internet for All Saints' pupils, teachers, parents and carers. It is an online space where pupils can access learning resources —anytime, anywhere!

These learning resources may include quizzes, problems to solve, forum discussions and links to educational websites.

Our VLE is designed to help pupils learn at home both independently and in partnership with their parents.

### Practical benefits for pupils:

Our Virtual Learning Environment will enable pupils to:

- ✓ access learning materials created by their teachers and others outside lesson time and from any location
- ✓ store work and notes online for use in homework and revision
- ✓ work at their own pace and with a wider choice of learning styles
- ✓ improve their ICT skills and online management
- ✓ participate in live discussions and forums with other students and teachers

### Practical benefits for parents & carers:

Our Virtual Learning Environment will enable parents and carers to:

- ✓ support children with learning which takes place outside school
- ✓ access their child's personal home page to keep track of their work and the curriculum
- ✓ engage with wider school issues through online communication tools
- ✓ become active partners with the school

If you do not have a computer with internet access, please let your child's teacher know. Some activities added to the VLE can be made available as a paper copy. We also recommend the use of other services with internet access such as **Maldon's** library.



Logging on to the VLE

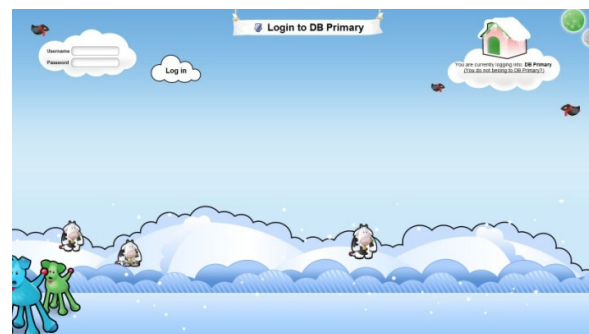
The easiest way to find our VLE is through the school's website at:

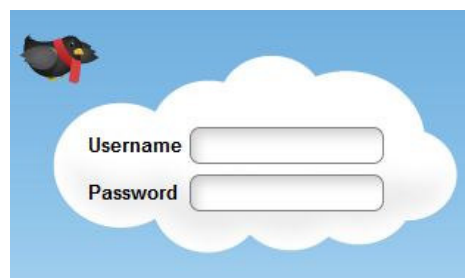
Then click onto Quick links drop down.

#### Children's Guidelines

- ★ Sensible behaviour when using the emails / blogs or forums.
- ★ Make sure that any pictures you upload (profile picture, or pictures in posts) are suitable for a school audience.
- ★ Keep your personal details, password safe.
- ★ Write in full sentences.
- ★ Sensibly express your opinions in forums.
- ★ Email your friends outside school time.
- ★ Share links to sites by posting them in your blog / forums.

#### Whistle Monitor: reporting inappropriate content



If a child or parent finds any content they believe is inappropriate, they can report this to a nominated "Whistle Monitor" at the school by clicking on the whistle icon. This will email the details to the nominated member(s) of staff. The email will contain a link and brief description of the offending page.
