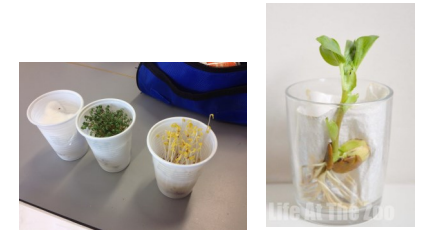
Geography
