We will make our own lighthouses and then create a pulley system. We will also create seaside paintings. We will design and make healthy smoothies.



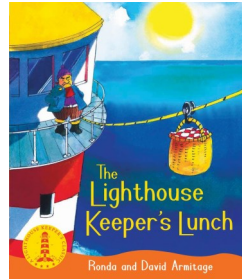
Geography

We will be identifying cities and coastal areas around the UK, naming many and exploring them through map work and role play.



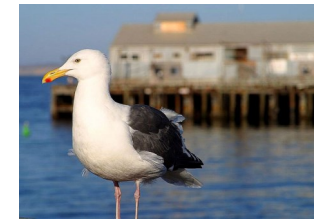
English
