You may want to test it out to see if it floats or sinks!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Reading and Writing</p> <p>Find out about a creature that lives under the sea. Draw/paint a picture and write a simple fact.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Understanding the world</p> <p>With an adult can you carefully explore things that are hot and cold? Can you draw/write about what you found?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Mathematics</p> <p>Can you find and name 2d shapes around your house?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Communication and Language</p> <p>We are going to learn lots of facts about different countries. Have a go at telling a fact to a friend or family member, you may want to film yourself telling it or even tell the class.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Personal, Social and Emotional</p> <p>The boy helps the penguin in 'Lost and Found', think of something you can do to help someone at home and record what you did.</p>

The Parents' Role in Homework

DO	DON'T
Listen to them read, or read to them everyday	Complete it for them
Ask them questions to expand their thinking, e.g. What....? When....? Why....? How....?	Make it all about expense (sometimes the cheapest ideas are the best)
Be willing to support their activity by listening to their ideas and suggesting ways forward	
Show them they can achieve
