**This half-term, our enrichment homework will be focussed on our Invaders & Settlers topic.
Your task is to complete one, or if you want, as many of the tasks set for you.**

<p align="center">Write a poem about Celtic/Roman Life</p> <p>Choose an aspect of Celtic or Roman life, research it, and then write a poem about what you have found. You may be able find some examples of songs/poems on the internet to give you inspiration should you need it. You could choose to do a Haiku or a Limerick or any other rhyming poem of your choice. Or you could write an acrostic poem for the word ROMANS.</p>	<p align="center">Create an outdoor game for a Celtic child to play</p> <p>Celtic children did not have the same luxuries that you have today such as televisions, scooters and other child friendly toys. They had to make do with whatever they could find out in the wilderness. We would like you to design and have a go at making/playing an outdoor game for a Celtic child. You can take pictures of yourself doing the activity or even film it. This can be done with a friend as well.</p>
<p align="center">Recreate a Roman Recipe</p> <p>I wonder if the food that the Romans ate back then was different to the food we eat today? Find a Roman recipe and have a go at recreating it. Take a picture of yourself making and following the recipe as well as the finished product. You could even write a short review on how it tasted and whether or not you would recommend it.</p>	<p align="center">Attack!</p> <p>We have learnt that, at its height, the Roman Empire was huge! Choose at least five countries, other than Britain, that were invaded by the Romans. Draw their flags and write an interesting fact about each country.</p> 
<p align="center">Create a maths sheet for a class of Roman children</p> <p>Using Roman numerals, create a maths activity sheet that a Roman child could use for homework. The calculations you choose can be as simple as you would like them to be, however it must all be done with Roman numerals so the children can read it.</p>	<p align="center">Make a model of a Roman Villa/Celtic Round House</p> <p>Using any materials you wish to, we would like you to recreate either a Roman Villa or a Celtic style Round House. Our trip to Colchester Castle will provide some inspiration for this task.</p>
<p align="center">Toga Tangle</p> <p>The Romans wore togas. See if you can make a toga and take a photo of you wearing it! Write some instructions for how you made the toga and how you put it on yourself.</p>	<p align="center">Roman Chariot</p> <p>Draw and describe a Roman chariot. You could even make a model of a chariot! What were the chariots used for? Who used them</p>

Please complete the enrichment homework and bring it into school on **Tuesday 24th February** where it will be displayed in the hall as part of open afternoon.

The work should be:

- Well presented, showing care and thought.	- Creative.
- A mixture of things that they have learnt at home and things they have learnt at school.	- Their own work - they might need help but they should not let their grown-ups do it for them.
