

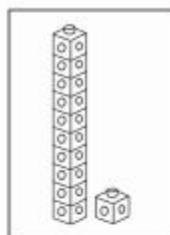
Week 15 (29/6/2020) Theme: Myths, Legends and Fables

Have a listen to some of Aesop's fables The Boy who Cried Wolf https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gKWktweAZb0 The Tortoise and the Hare https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=SUngzUtFr7Q The Lion and the Mouse https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CUfEZ6JicTE Which is your favourite - can you write about it? Can you retell the story? What messages do you think they are trying to tell us? Why is it important not to lie? Is slow and steady the best way to win the race? Why is it important to be kind to others? Fairy Tales are myths - take Jack and the Beanstalk for example. Could you read or listen to the story? Imagine climbing up the beanstalk - can you write about how you'd feel. What did you find at the top? Who was up there? The giant in Jack and the Beanstalk had some wonderful treasures. Can you create your own basket of treasures - what can you say about each treasure? Why are they special to you? Could you draw your basket and label them? Read Geroge's Dragon https://www.greatstaughton.cambs.sch.uk/georges-dragon/ George has a dragon as a pet! Could you design a pet dragon and write about what it likes.	Can you use the Jack and the Beanstalk I spy activity (scroll down to find it). Can you count how many of each object there is? Can you add two lots of the items together? Can you write the sum down? Can you draw or cut out some 'beanstalks' and use the language of size to put them in order? Or maybe, like the giant someone in your family has bigger feet - could you draw round your family's feet and put them in order of length? Can you use 2D shapes to make a picture of a castle? Can you say how many of each shape you used i.e. I used 4 squares to make my castle. The beanstalk was very tall. Can you find 5 things around your home that are taller than you? Cinderella had to leave the ball at 12 o'clock. Maybe you could use a clock to look at different o'clocks? https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=uedvwH6Ay18 Watch and learn the teen number song. Can you make up a dance to the music? Could you partner up with someone in your family and teach it to them? Can you collect some twigs like The Three Little Pigs to play 'Pick Up Sticks'. Hold sticks in a bundle above the ground and drop them gently. Then, take turns to take a stick from the pile without moving any of the other sticks.

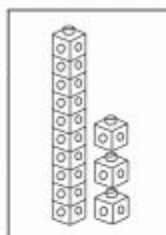

Listen to The Tortoise and the Hare song https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WF8iaqRql60 Can you join in? Can you perform it? Can you write your own song for the fable? How about some tortoise craft? Could you use an egg box to make a little tortoise to race, see below for some pictures as inspiration. Read 'The Singing Mermaid' or another story about mermaids. A Mermaid is half human half fish, could you design your own mythical creature which could be a mixture of two different animals. Unicorns are another mythical creature, perhaps you could make your own unicorn.  In some stories Knights would try to capture dragons. Have a go at making or building a dragon catcher. Or how about using handprints to create lion and mouse artwork? Scroll down for an example. In Jack and the beanstalk, there was an instrument called a harp. Do you know what this is? Could you listen to some harp music and create dances and movements to match the music. Could you use some junk modeling or construction material like Duplo/Lego to make your own fairy tale castle. Cardboard boxes are super good for this!	Cinderella had lots of chores to do before she went to the ball. Could you have some bowls of soapy water and practise washing up. You could wash plastic plates and cups, or maybe you'll be allowed to wash up some real dishes! Could you try and grow some beans like Jack in Jack and the beanstalk? What do they need to grow? Where would be the best place to keep them? What do you need to do to look after them? Do you have sand at home? Can you make a castle with sand? What is easier to build with - wet or dry sand? What happens to the sand when it is dry? What happens when it is wet? Could you draw a map for one of the fables or fairy tales? What would you need to include in your map? What is mentioned in the story? Or could you draw a fairy tale land and include parts from lots of different stories? (see an example below) Find out about mythical creatures e.g, unicorns, mermaids and dragons. Mermaids need a waterproof tail to swim through the water. Can you explore which materials you have around the house that are waterproof. Record your findings.

The possibilities are endless with fairy tales and fables - Can't wait to see what you all get up to!*

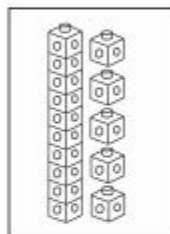

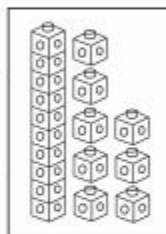
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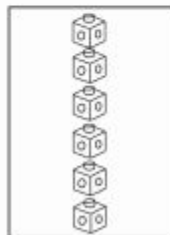
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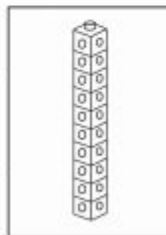
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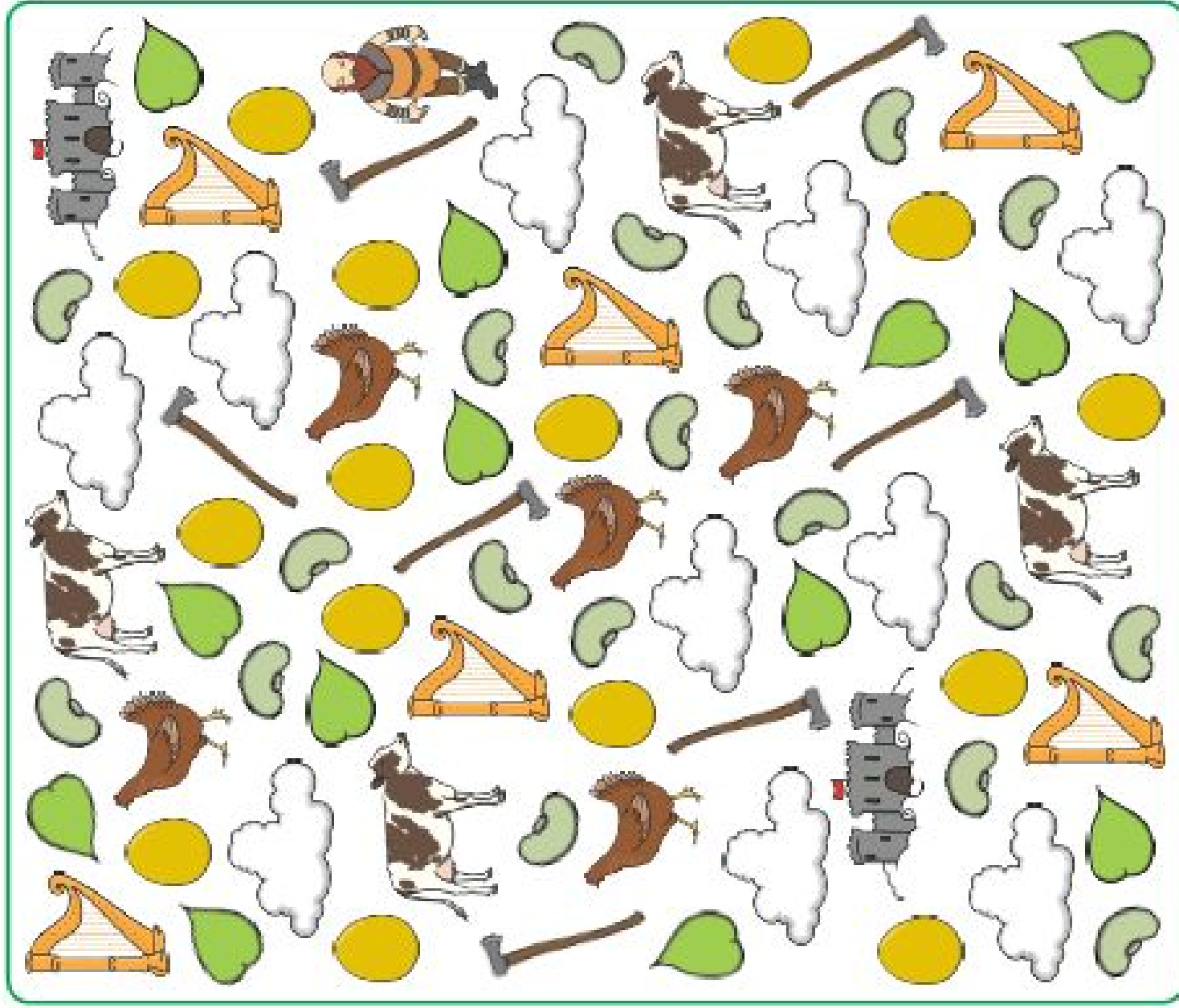
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Jack and the Beanstalk I Spy and Count to 20
