

Week (18.5.20) Theme: A Night at the Museum EYFS

English	Maths	PE and Wellbeing
First of all find out what a museum is? What are they for? Have you ever been to a Museum? If so, what did you like/dislike? Check out the Dino - Directory. Pick your favourite dinosaur & make a fact file. (LINK) You may also want to watch Andy's Dinosaur adventures on Cbeebies to learn about different dinosaurs. This may help you write your fact file. Watch the film 'Night at the Museum'. Who was your favourite character and why? Can you write a film review and synopsis? Why don't you draw your favourite character? Learn about toys from the past by reading this e-book (LINK) Can you choose your favourite toy from the past and your favourite toy from now and write about each of them. Imagine if your toys came to life, what adventures would they go on? Perhaps you could write a story called "The Day My Toys Came to Life" You may want to watch Toy Story for some ideas! Talk to your grown ups about their favourite toys when they were a child. You may be lucky enough to see a photo or they may still have it. You could even video call your Grandparents and ask them about their favourite toys when they were little too! You may even want to find out about other favourite things from your grown ups past like their favourite TV programme. Watch it together and have a chat about what you liked or didn't like. One of our favourites in EYFS was Button Moon or Bagpuss!	Have a look at different 3d shapes and learn the name of them Look around your house and find real objects that are 3d shapes. Create a shape museum for your family to see. Maybe you could facetime other family members and give them a tour! Here is an example  This week's maths challenge is to learn to count in 10s, perhaps you could use your toys to help you. Set up a toy shop and take turns with your family to be the shopkeeper. Use coins to pay for the toys, maybe you could even use 2ps or 10ps.
