

Week 8 (11.5.20) Theme: Brilliant Britain EYFS

English	Maths	PE and Wellbeing
The largest city in Great Britain is London. Listen to the story 'Katie in London' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ImrNxvC9bb4 Can you find out about one famous landmark in London that interests you? Perhaps the Tower of London, Buckingham Palace or Big Ben. You could change the name of the story to include your name instead and write your own version of the story with places that you visit. What is your favourite place in Britain? Write about a place in Britain you have visited, what was there? Why did you like it so much? British Weather! It is always a talking point! https://www.bbc.co.uk/weather Watch some BBC weather clips and then try writing your own weather forecast for the day or rest of the week. Maybe you would like to film yourself presenting the forecast! Britain is full of amazing wildlife! https://www.woodlandtrust.org.uk/trees-woods-and-wildlife/animals/mammals/ Can you write a fact file about native British wildlife? Choose one or two animals to write about. Try writing an acrostic poem about Britain. Use the letters in Britain as the start of each new line in your poem and try to use lots of description to describe how great it is! Write what you would do if you could be King or Queen for a day. During the war there were spies, watch https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tkD1Bu38bHQ and then draw/write your own secret message using your phonics.	Make a record of the birds you see in your garden. Using this information make a bar graph or pictogram. You can make pictograms about other subjects too, you could ask your family their favourites. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/Flash.aspx?f=pictograms Looking at Britain's landmarks compare them by size, either length or height. You could measure the members of your family and order them by tallest to shortest. You could measure using different items e.g. how many teddy bears tall is mummy? Use topmarks to compare size. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/early-years/lets-compare Explore missing numbers, using number cards, numicon or a missing number worksheet https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/eyfs-missing-number-tracks-0-20-t-m-31420 Continue exploring shapes, learn to name them and list their properties e.g it has 3 edges, it has 3 corners etc. Make a poster or flashcards to teach someone else about shapes. You can even make a shape picture. Can you choose who the best one is, in your opinion. Why do you think they are the best? Make a video of you trying their sport. Keep an eye on some animals in a British zoo. Make a union jack flag, bunting or paper chains to celebrate VE Day. Can you make a unique flag for your family? Bake a wartime recipe (twinkl) or find out about traditional british food (cottage pie, apple crumble) and recreate it in an imaginative way or help an adult at home to prepare dinner for you and your family. Learn about a famous British Artist – maybe Andy Goldsworthy? Make your own piece of art inspired by him? Make a crown for the Queen. Who else is a member of the Royal family? Can you draw a family tree for the Royal family? Or you might also like to draw your own family tree. Find facts about Britain https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-g-115-our-country-the-uk-facts-powerpoint Look at a map of Britain and discuss where London and other major cities are. Where in Britain do you live? Learn your address. Find out why we need an address. Keep a record for the week of the different birds you see. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-t-17664-garden-birds-siting-checklist Learn about other British wildlife – foxes, badgers, hedgehogs etc, make a factfile. Learn about VE Day, why do we have it? How are people marking the occasion? Explore and identify trees. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t2-s-874-tree-identification-photo-sheet Which ones are native to Britain? On your walk record the types of trees you see, maybe collect a leaf from each and discuss how they are similar/different. Then you could use the leaves to make your Andy Goldsworthy inspired picture.
