Watch Caterpillar Shoes https://www.literacyshed.com/caterpillar-shoes.html Design a pair of shoes for a minibeast of your choice. Read 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and then create your own story version. What would your caterpillar eat on Monday? Watch 'Minibeast Adventure with Jess' https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/shows/mini-beast-adventure-with-jess Write a fact file about a minibeast that you learn about. Write your own 'What am I?' minibeast quiz. Eg, I am long with lots of legs. I was born from an egg. I will turn into another minibeast. What am I? Have a look on your bookshelf and see if you can find any books about minibeasts. If you do then you can read them and see which one is your favourite. Talk to your grown ups about what happens in the story, where it is set and who the characters are. Have a go at making up your own story about a minibeast. If you don't have any books then you can listen to 'Slug needs a hug' or 'Spinderalla' on youtube	Learn about symmetry and create a symmetrical butterfly picture. Play https://www.topmarks.co.uk/symmetry/symmetry-matching Practice doubling numbers, use ladybird spots to help you. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-n-672-double-the-ladybird-spots-sheets Count the different bugs you created on your minibeast hunt and sort them e.g. how many snails? How many worms? You could then sort them into different groups, legs/no legs or wings/no wings. Find out how many legs different minibeasts have and have a go at making your own ones making sure you count the legs carefully. Use 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' to learn about the days of the week. How many days are in a week? Which days are school days and which days are the weekend? Can you say the days in the right order? Make your own minibeast hotel - fill a suitable container with leaves, sticks, stones, compost etc. Observe your hotel over time to see who visits! Use items in your recycling to make a junk model of a minibeast. Paint a rock bug - find a stone or pebble and turn it into a minibeast using paint. Read or watch (on youtube) 'Norman the Slug with a Silly Shell.' and design your own shell for Norman to wear. Bake some biscuits and use icing to decorate them to look like minibeast, perhaps like ladybirds.	Go for a minibeast hunt. Record the different types of minibeasts you find and where you found them eg, under rocks, in the soil, on plants. Find out about the life cycle of a butterfly or bee and make your own.
