

Year 3/4 homework

Below you will find a range of learning activities for you to do at home. Try to choose activities from the different subjects to continue your learning in a range of subjects. You also have the enrichment homework set for this half term. This has lots of topic related activities to choose from. Instead of completing just one as you normally do, you could pick 2 or even 3!

ENGLISH/TOPIC

- Research facts about the Vikings and use these to create one of the following; a Viking fact book, a magazine for Vikings or a Viking topic lesson plan. If you choose the magazine try to include things you would see in a normal magazine, such as adverts, puzzles and competitions, advice pages and horoscopes. If you choose the Viking topic lesson plan, prepare to teach a 30 minute lesson on any part of the Viking topic, including any activities you would like the class to complete. When we are back in school together we will find some time for these lessons to actually take place and you can be the teacher for the lesson.

MATHS

- Use Times Tables Rockstars and practice your quick recall of the times tables.
- Practice other key number facts such as doubles and number bonds to 10, 20 and 100.
- Make a poster/booklet called "All I have learnt about Maths at All Saints" In this book you could demonstrate how to add and subtract, using the column method, as well as all the other things you have learnt.

- Year 3

Practice column multiplication, get someone to write you some questions and complete them like the example here, where you carry across the tens.

SCIENCE

- In school we have looked at the 5 types of scientific enquiry and recently really enjoyed researching, where we found out about an animal. Carry out some more research, either of a planet, type of tree, type of habitat or an animal very different from your first piece of research.

ART

- Make sure you are prepared for Battle by making your sword and shield.

• Now that we have learnt about the events of the Battle of Maldon that took place in 991 AD, depict the events in the form of a collage using whatever materials you want. • Or make a collage or model of a Viking longship.
<u>P.E</u> • Make up a training programme for a Viking. Think of exercises they might need to support them in their line of work, such as exercises to develop arm and leg strength, for rowing. Or exercises for developing the upper body strength needed to wield a sword in battle. They will also need leg strength exercises for marching. What other tasks did they do that they would need to keep physically fit for?
<u>ENGLISH SKILLS</u> • Practice your handwriting by making either an alphabet poster of upper and lower case letters, or through writing out your spellings, making sure you practice joining letters correctly. • Keep reading, see how many 10 minutes you can read for. • Continue to practice all the spellings in the coloured groups. You can find these in your reading record and your homework book. • Read to an adult then ask them questions to check that they have listened and understood. • Make a punctuation poster explaining how to use all the types of punctuation you have learnt.
<u>MUSIC</u> • Practice your house music competition song and keep singing while you wash your hands!
<u>FRENCH</u> • Make a French Bingo game to practice how to say the numbers in French.
<u>R.E</u> • Design and make a special Easter card for someone in your family. Try to make part of it move.
