Art

We will develop our drawing skills by sketching plants and fruits as part of still-life studies. We will use these skills to inform our clay relief work, creating tiles inspired by nature and the rainforest.

English

We will write non-chronological reports on animals found in the rainforest. We will also be inspired by 'The Jungle Book' to write setting descriptions, describe atmosphere and write tense, chase scenes.

Computing

We will design and build our own apps.

PSHE

We will look at what happens when the law is broken, understand what prejudice and discrimination looks like and how we can reduce waste and energy to help the environment.

R.E.

We will be looking at why the Torah is so important for Jewish people.

French

We will be learning to describe items of clothing using adjectives.

Geography

We will study Central and Southern America, investigating their climate, the plants and animals that can be found in these areas.

As part of our investigation we will look at conservation, biomes and vegetation belts, locate continents and their draw comparisons.



Science

Children will learn about living things and their habitats focusing on how they have adapted to their habitats and their respective life-cycles. Look at the process of metamorphosis by breeding our own butterflies.



Music

We will use the weather and the rainforest for inspiration for compositions and include singing in a round.
