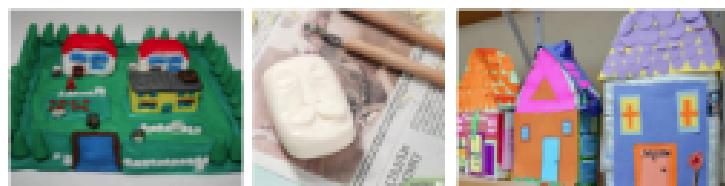

Enrichment Tasks

You could be a sculptor...

Create a sculpture or model of something, someone or somewhere that makes you think of Maldon.

You could build your favourite building from recycled materials, model a Maldon Salt box using plasticine or even carve a portrait of Byrhtnoth from a bar of soap!



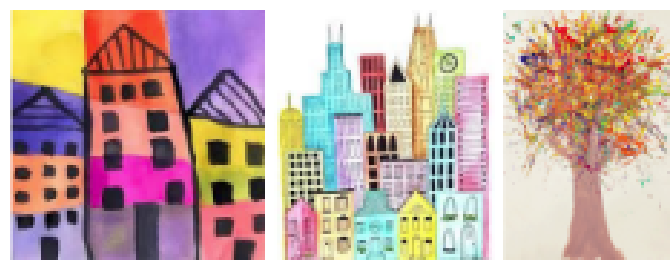
You could even use natural materials to design some 'Art in Nature'- don't forget to take a photo so we can see what you have created.

You could be a painter...

Use paint to capture a scene from your local area. It could be your house, a tree in your garden or on your road or somewhere you pass on your walk or drive to school.

Your finished art work could be realistic or abstract.

Think about the type of paint you want to use- water colours, poster paint or acrylics- and how you will apply it- you don't have to use a brush!



You could create a still life masterpiece...

Simply using pencil or coloured pencils, draw a picture of some objects that make you think of Maldon.

You could collect things on a walk or find things in your house. Maybe an item from your school bag, a piece of kit from a club you take part in or even a chocolate bar from your favourite local shop.

Arrange your items on the table and get sketching.

Think about size and proportion and light and shade and take time to carefully record your scene.



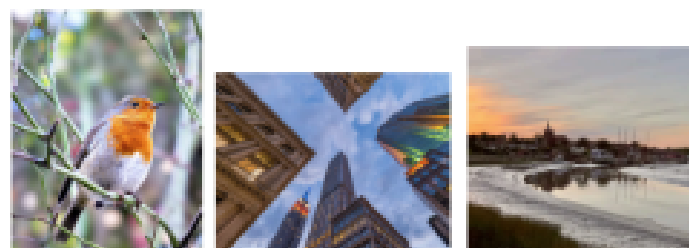
You could be a photographer...

Art can take many forms and this includes photography.

Borrow a camera and snap some pictures of Maldon. It could be a beautiful sunset from your bedroom window, some birds or animals you spot in or around the town or perhaps a place in the town that is special to you.

Be creative- think about the angle you take the picture from- could you show us something familiar in a way we have not seen before? Could you zoom in to give us a close up shot?

Don't forget to give your photo/ photos a title.
