Enrichment Tasks

Create a seaside collage...

Create a collage of a beach or coastal scene. You could tear coloured paper to create a choppy sea, use fabric scraps to create plants and trees or try adding real sand.

You could recreate a scene from a photo or one from your imagination. Perhaps you could imagine your dream holiday destination and show us all what it would look like.



Capture the sun!

Make a suncatcher for your window.



Sun catchers can be made in many different ways using a range of materials. The most popular is to use sticky back plastic and tissue paper but you could also try glue, wax paper and even flowers or leaves.

There are many guides and videos online that can help you find a method you like.



Summer memories

Draw or paint your favourite summer memory.



This could be a water colour painting of a moment from a family holiday, a sketch of your favourite ice cream or summer snack or maybe a drawing of your pet lying in the summer sunshine.

You can draw or paint whatever it is that makes you remember the summer.

Think about the colours you will choose- warm colours or cool colours? Think about the size of your art work and whether you will work in landscape or portrait format.

Signs of Summer

Take a walk around your garden or out in Maldon and snap some photos of any signs of summer you notice.

It could be the sun reflecting in the estuary, the flowers in a garden or summer clothes on display in a shop window.

Think about how you will present your photos. Could you print them and arrange them artistically?
