



Menu of Activities - Week Beginning 11.01.21

Whilst you are learning at home, every day you will have recorded English and Maths lessons from your KS2 teachers. In school, we also learn lots of other different subjects! Each week we will post a menu of activities that link to our topic. Across the week, you can select which of these activities that you would like to do, perhaps in the afternoons, but make sure that you do your Maths and English lessons too.

Subject	Activity
Science	Healthy teeth/Healthy Diet (Sugar experiment) - see Miss Cooch's remote lesson for this week. You can find the video for this lesson HERE or you can click on the link underneath this menu of activities on the school website.
Art and DT	We hope you enjoyed your art from last week. We will continue to look at Ancient Egypt as inspiration for our artwork. Use the powerpoint (linked HERE or downloadable from the same place on the school website as this menu of activities) to find out what your task is this week. We look forward to seeing some of your creations!
RE	This week we will continue with the story of Joseph. Think back to last week's lessons and the story that you retold to your family members. How do you think things are going for Joseph? What do you think he might be feeling? What do you think his next actions might be? Why do you think Joseph is able to interpret dreams - who might be helping him? Use the powerpoint (linked HERE or downloadable from the same place on the school website as this menu of activities) to learn about the next part of the story. Miss Martin has voiced over the slides for you so you can click where it tells you to and listen to her read the slides. These audio clips will not work in the PDF version or if you open it in Google Slides so if you use versions then you may need an adult to help you to read it.
Computing	(MAKE SURE YOU DO YOUR SCIENCE LESSON BEFORE THIS LESSON!) This week we want you to think about documentaries, short informative TV programmes or films about a particular topic. For example, Planet Earth or Blue Planet are very well known documentaries about our planet and natural world. The famous presenter and narrator for those programmes is none other than David Attenborough! Watch a few clips from those documentaries or others to get the idea of how they are filmed and presented. Over the next few weeks you will become presenters of your very own documentary. That documentary will be about your Science topic this half term - Teeth. Once you have done your science lesson for this week you will have learnt a lot about keeping teeth healthy. As you have not yet finished learning about Teeth you will not be making your documentaries for a few weeks, this week all we want you to think about is what it takes to be a fantastic presenter of a documentary. How do they speak? In what way do they speak? When you see them on screen how are they standing? Are they moving? Any actions or facial expressions? Are their clothes specifically suited to the programme? You will need to make notes on this. Try using 'Google Slides' or 'Powerpoint' to make a presentation all about being a documentary presenter.

History and Geography

This week you will be learning about Ancient Egyptian hieroglyphs. Use the powerpoint (linked [HERE](#) or downloadable from the same place on the school website as this menu of activities).
