| Art and DT | <p>As we are back in school next week, we have decided to continue to design and construct our Death Masks in school. However, we will be also doing some other Egyptian art to get you ready for this. | RE         | <p>Can you remember what the first 9 plagues of Egypt were? Each time the Pharaoh said "NO, I will not let your people go!" His heart was hard. So God sent the 10th and final plague. Watch: <a href="#">The ten plagues of Egypt</a></p> <p>Think about the effect of the plagues on the Egyptians and how they would have felt (<i>angry, in despair, devastated</i>) and the feelings of the Hebrew slaves (<i>hopeful, expectant, excited but also worried about starting a new life</i>).</p> <p>How did the Hebrews avoid having their sons killed? Jewish people celebrate this miracle in a festival called <u>Passover</u>, (or Pesach) which will learn more about in coming lessons.</p> <p><b>TASK:</b> read the story of the plagues and answer the questions. (Remember small details of the stories may be different because the Bible has been translated many times.)</p> <p>There are 2 sheets to choose from. You only need to choose <u>one</u> of them to complete. <a href="#">Passover story 1</a> has a shorter story than <a href="#">Passover story 2</a>. Don't worry if you can't print them, read them on screen and write your answer on a piece of paper!</p> |

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| <b>History and Geography</b> | <p>During last week's History you were introduced to the Weighing of the Heart Ceremony. During this ceremony, the god Ammut was always on hand after you died, in case she was needed. The ancient Egyptians believed that to enter your afterlife, your heart had to be light. You gained a light heart by doing many good deeds during your lifetime. After you died, on your way to your afterlife, you had to travel through the Hall of Maat. The god Anubis weighed your heart. If your heart was as light as a feather, you passed Maat's test, and entered your afterlife. Can you draw a picture of what you are hearing? Or make up a skeleton dance to go with the music? What instrument do you think is making the bone sound?</p> <p>This song <a href="#">Dem Bones</a> is one we could sing in Collective Worship and based on a text from the Old Testament of the Bible (Ezekiel Chapter 37). The story is told by Ezekiel the prophet who visited 'The Valley of Dry Bones' and brought them to life, following God's command. It's a fun song to sing, especially if you point to the bones as you sing them.
