



Menu of Activities - Week Beginning 22.2.21

Each week we will post a menu of activities that link to our topic. Across the week, you can select which of these activities that you would like to do, perhaps in the afternoons, but make sure that you do your Maths, Phonics and English lessons too.

Subject	Activity	
Science & outdoor activities	<i>Scavenger Hunt: Living, dead or never alive</i>    First have a go at this odd one out activity. There is no right or wrong answer to this activity, but the aeroplane could be the odd one out because it is not alive. All living things move but not all moving things are alive!	

	How do you know if something is alive? Have a discussion and see if you can come up with a checklist of characteristics of living things. There are 7 characteristics of living things; they move, grow, feed, reproduce, need air, get rid of waste and react to their surroundings. At this age don't worry about getting all of them! Now, watch this animation on the BBC Bitesize website. We can classify things around us as either living, dead or never alive. Now head outside for a walk or in your garden with your checklist. Look closely at the things you find in that space, comparing them to the checklist. Group the things you find. Are they alive? Dead? Never alive? Can you justify your decisions? Some things will be easy to classify and others will be far trickier - and remember, some of the characteristics of living things are not always visible to the observer. You could repeat the activity in a different environment - how do the things you find vary in the two places? Can you suggest any reasons why?
Art and DT	This week your challenge is to build a bridge. Your bridge needs to be strong enough to hold a knight, or a dragon, or another toy of your choice. Look at the Google Slides document for full instructions on what to do. It is saved in this week's star drive.

History and Geography	Flags are great fun to investigate! Can you find out how the Union Jack, the flag of Great Britain, is made up? Which other countries feature the Union Jack in their design? Can you find out which country's flags have a dragon on them, and then design your own family flag?		
RE	Can you remember we have looked at symbols found around in school and designed a new school badge using symbols to represent attitudes, values and special attributes of the school. We have learned about The Buddha, the Bodhi tree and how he is remembered at the festival of Wesak through the giving of cards and lighting of lanterns.  Star of David This is the Star of David and it has been the symbol for a special group of people called Jews for a very long time. People think it was the shield badge for the second king of the Jews called David. There are lots of stories about David in the Bible. One of them shows he was brave even from a very young age. Watch story of David and Goliath at Assemblies KS1 - David and Goliath (part way down the page). TASK: Make a Star of David from strips of blue card / paper / straws coloured in blue> Make sure they are all the same length (make two triangles and overlap). Explain to a friend who it reminds people about.
