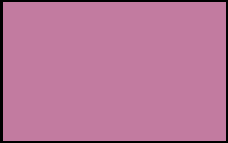
Each week we will post a menu of activities that link to our topic. Across the week, you can select which of these activities that you would like to do, perhaps in the afternoons, but make sure that you do your Maths, Phonics and English lessons too.

Subject	Activity
Science & outdoor activities	<u>Chinese New Year Science Investigation</u> In the Chinese New Year Tradition, red envelopes are given to children containing brand new money. Make old pennies shiny and new with this science activity. Fill 5 bowls with the following ingredients and see what happens when you put a penny in. It is best to use a timer, and leave the penny in for about five minutes. Really dirty pennies are the best!! (Or 2p coins.) 1 bowl vinegar 1 bowl salt 1 bowl salt and vinegar 1 bowl salt and water

	1 bowl of ketchup Let the children hypothesize about what they think will happen. Encourage them to use their skills of observation to describe what happens after dipping each penny in a bowl. What conclusions can they come up with? If you would like to record this, there is a worksheet in this week's folder, but it's fine to just do the experiment and have lots of fun!
Art and DT	This week we are going to use Paul Klee as our artistic inspiration. This picture is called Castle and Sun. It is made up of many shapes. Can you make a similar castle picture using lots of different shapes? You could print it, use templates, draw round objects or go freehand. RE	Think about how you celebrate your birthday. Do you have special food, clothes, traditions, meeting family and friends, gifts and cards? We are going to learn about how Buddhists celebrate Buddha's life. Watch this video: https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/watch/lets-celebrate-wesak  The card remembers when The Buddha found the answer to life's problems and questions. It was as if a light had been turned on in his head. Have you ever heard anyone say they had "a light bulb moment"? Lanterns are a symbol of light.

Music	The Queen's soldiers that parade outside Buckingham Palace and Windsor Castle are called the Queen's Guard. They have to be very good at marching in time to music.
