Maths	Practise counting to 20 and recognising the numbers 1 to 20 out of order.
Phonics	Practise reading and writing the high frequency words, which can be found in their reading diaries.

Enrichment Homework

In EYFS this term our topics are 'Wings, Stings and Wiggly Things' and 'Community Champions'. Below are some enrichment tasks that children can complete at home. This is their chance to show off their individual styles and approaches to learning and presenting their work. You only need to complete one task, the focus is on quality work, something that they will be proud of.

Become a reporter... (Writing) Find out what your grown-ups do when you are at school and write about them.	Become a nature detective... (Understanding the World) Make a home for a minibeast, you could draw it, take a photo of it and then write about it.
Become a shopkeeper... (Mathematics) Set up your own pretend shop and practice using coins. You could take a photo or write about what you did.	Become an artist... (Expressive arts and design) Create a piece of art on your favourite minibeast. You could use paint, pens, crayons, collage or something else.

DO	DON'T
Listen to them read, or read to them everyday	Complete it for them
Ask them questions to expand their thinking, e.g. What....? When....? Why....? How....?	Make it all about expense (sometimes the cheapest ideas are the best)
Be willing to support their activity by listening to their ideas and suggesting ways forward	
Show them they can achieve
