This is their chance to show off their individual styles and approaches to learning and presenting their work. Remember children, you only need to complete one task, the focus is on quality work that you will be proud of.

<u>Geometric Castle</u> Draw a picture of a castle using only 2D shapes. Use as many as possible and try to use lots of different shapes. Colour your picture in. Or you could make this a collage and cut all of the shapes out.	<u>Make a model</u> Use your imagination and your making skills to create your own castle or dragon model. Use any materials that you chose to make your masterpiece. Perhaps you could make your model using objects that you find outside and then take a photo of your work?
<u>Super Story Teller</u> Write a story about an adventure that you have after walking through a magical door in a castle.	<u>Castles word search</u> Make up your own word search using castle words. Make it tricky so you can try it out on your classmates. Don't forget to include the solution!
<u>ICT Wizard</u> Do you enjoy using computers? Create a fact sheet about a famous castle on Google Slides or Docs- add pictures and text and think about layout. Try to use some of the skills we have learnt before.	<u>The Knights' Charge!</u> King Percy sees an enemy army approaching his castle. There are horses and men. He can see 50 legs. How many horses and how many men? Find all the possible answers. Present your answers carefully.
