<u>Google Earth</u> Use Google Earth to travel the world! What famous landmarks can you find? Try typing in your own postcode. Perhaps you could make a travel poster to showcase some of the places that you have visited. 	<u>Outside fun!</u> Make an explorer tent in your house or garden. Imagine you're an explorer! Take some photos or write about your adventure. 
<u>Wildlife explorer</u> Become a wildlife explorer - what animals and insects can you find in your garden or the park? Make a list or a factfile to show others what you found.	<u>Around the World</u> Use a map to find a different country. It might be a place you have visited. Draw and colour the flag for this country. Can you find out any more information about this country and make a fact file?
<u>Ways to Travel</u> There are many different ways of travelling from one place to another. Do you have a favourite? Can you find out about some different modes of transport that they use in other places such as gondolas in Venice or reindeer sleds in Lapland. Perhaps draw them and add some of the information you find. Have you found a new favourite?	<u>Cooking from around the world!</u> With your adult, make some food from a different country. Take photos or draw a picture. We hope it is tasty!
