
Sickness:

As soon as you know your child will not be attending school on a normal school-day, please let the school know. You can do this in a number of ways:

- Studybugs (download the app on your phone)
- Telephone the school, 01621 853519 option 2
- email: admin@allsaintsprimaryschoolmaldon.co.uk
- Or tell us by popping in and speaking in person to someone in the office

Studybugs for Parents and Carers



A better, safer way to report when your child is sick and off school.

With a few quick taps or clicks, you can give your child's school all they need to record absence due to illness.

Confidential and secure. Your personal data is kept strictly confidential between you and your child's school. We never share your personal data with third parties. Your child's school cannot see your location. All shared illness data is first anonymised so your personal data is always kept confidential. You can also opt out of having your anonymised data shared. Studybugs is hosted from purpose-built secure facilities and all communications with our apps and website are encrypted.

Pre-booked appointments (for example medical, dental, opticians, physio etc):

As soon as you know your child has an appointment that falls during the normal school day, please let the school know. You can do this by:

- Telephoning the school office on 01621 853519 (select option 4)
- Or by email: admin@allsaintsprimaryschoolmaldon.co.uk
- Or tell us by popping in and speaking in person to someone in the office

If the appointment falls during a lunch period, please remember to feed your child before returning them to school later that day.

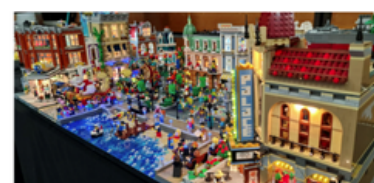
