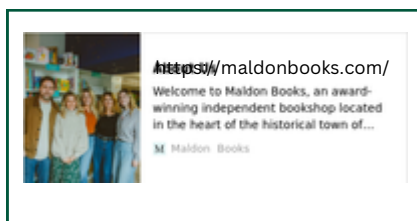
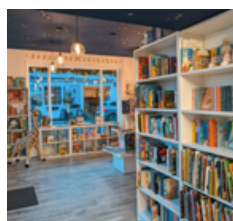
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world book day

What do I need to know about the School Uniform Policy?

To help us support the School Uniform Policy, here are some reminders for what is expected, (particularly what to do with long hair or if your child wears earrings):

- Should children choose to wear their hair long then this will need to be tied back to support health and hygiene.
- Jewellery should not be worn with the exception of small studded earrings. There should be no hooped or dangly earrings.
- Earrings must be removed for PE lessons. **If the child cannot remove them independently then they should not wear earrings to school on the day of PE.** Unfortunately taping earrings is no longer a viable option, in line with Local Authority guidance.
- School shoes should be completely black. There should be no trainers with white or coloured flashing, logos or sole trim.
- We would not expect primary age pupils to wear makeup to school, particularly items which detract from pupils learning, such as false nails.
